Design Opportunities in Qatar. Qatar's 2030 Vision plan is to transform itself from a carbon-based economy and is combined with the award of the 2022 FIFA World Cup, Qatar is spending over \$250 billion on physical infrastructure and other developments over the next five years.

Design Opportunities in Saudi Arabia. Saudi Arabia offers one of the biggest opportunity in the region for firms in the architecture and engineering services sector. There are \$960 billion worth of projects planned or under way in Saudi Arabia. Of these, more than \$700 billion are megaprojects, or large master planned developments of more than \$1 billion.
